

Leader Bible Study Older Children's Lesson

Flower gardens are beautiful when the gardener has taken time to till the soil, plant the seeds, and water the plants. If the gardener does not skillfully take care of the plants the garden will resemble more of a plant graveyard than a vibrant garden. The problem is that people love the produce of a garden... the pretty flowers, the vegetables, fruits, etc. They love the harvest, but do not care much for the process of maintaining the garden. The harvest is wonderful because the gardener is given a front row seat to the product of the hours of labor in maintaining the garden. Scripture refers to God as the Lord of the harvest. The Holy Spirit is the only one to bring about the harvest of salvation for the unsaved. He brings those who are dead in sin to life in Him. God is gracious because He uses Christians as His vessels to plant the seeds of salvation in the lives of those around them.

This lesson, primarily found in Matthew 9:35-38, depicts a general overview of the ministry of Jesus. It tells of Him proclaiming the good news of the gospel and healing the sick. It shares His great compassion and burden for the lost. The story ends with Jesus instructing the disciples by saying, "The harvest is abundant, but the workers are few. Therefore, pray to the Lord of the harvest to send out workers into his harvest" (CSB). This verse is one of many in the Bible that commissions those who have been saved to go and share the good news of the gospel (Isaiah 6:8; Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 1:8; Romans 10:14-15) with those around them. Our children need to know this commission applies to them as well. Use this lesson to encourage children to share the good news of the gospel of Jesus Christ with those in their homes, in their schools, and in their spheres of influence. Help them think of practical ways they can do this!

Another aspect of this lesson is the mission emphasis on the Reach Texas State Offering and the encouragement for children to participate. This offering goes above and beyond our tithes to ensure people hear about the gospel. If your children did not bring money to give today, help them make a plan to do so later.

Be sure to look through this entire guide and pick a few of the application activities to complete in your class. You can edit the order and flow of the lesson to fit your class. We can't wait to hear how your children are reaching their friends and neighbors for Jesus.

Introduction Activity: “Numbers Matter” (10 minutes)

Welcome children to class by name. Instruct them to stand along the wall. Select a number of students that would be approximately 68% of your class to go stand along the wall.

Say, “There are approximately 28 million people in the state of Texas! That’s a lot of people right?! Of that 28 million people, approximately 19 million people do not have a relationship with Jesus Christ. When you came into class I divided you up to try to give you a visual of that number. That is way over half of the population of Texas that has not recognized Jesus as their Savior and as their king. Today, our lesson is about how we can minister to the needs of those around us and share with them the good news of the gospel!”

Ask, “Does anyone know what the word gospel means?” Give time for responses. Thank children for answering.

Say, “The gospel means good news! When we read about the gospel or the good news in the Bible, it is talking about Jesus dying on the cross for our sins and rising from the dead so that we can have a relationship with God! The good news is that we can have a relationship with Him!”

Instruct kids to go find someone and share something good that has happened to them this week.

“When something good happens we love to share it with other people, in the same way we can share with those around us, the best news of all... the truth that God loves us!”

Bible Story: Matthew 9:35-38

Materials Needed: Bibles for every child

Instruct children to turn in their Bibles to Matthew 9:35-38. Help children find the Scripture. Instruct kids to point to verse 35 in the Bible.

Say, “God’s Word is absolutely true all of the time. What we are going to read today really happened!”

Read aloud Matthew 9:35-38.

Say, “Jesus modeled for us what it means to proclaim the good news! He went to the towns and the villages. He shared the good news by speaking. He healed people from their sickness. He had compassion for the people he met along the way.”

Ask, “What do you think compassion means?” Give time for answers. “Compassion means to care for other people. To treat them with kindness. To help them with their needs.”

Say, "The Bible teaches us to share the good news with everyone we meet. We want people to know God loves us and wants to have a relationship with us. Some of the best ways to do this is by helping others, showing kindness, and making friends. Jesus shared His love with all people even those who were sad, lonely, poor, and needy. In the same way, there are people that you see every single day at school, at the baseball/softball fields, in art class, even in the grocery store that need to know God loves them!"

Pray, "Thank you God for the good news of Jesus. Please give us boldness to share the Good News with those we see at school, at baseball/softball, in art class, and even in the grocery store! We love you, Jesus. Amen."

Give Activity: "The Great Giving Challenge" (10 minutes)

Materials Needed: Hillcrest Baptist Church - Disaster Relief video (sbtexas.com/resource/reach-texas-missions-offering-2022-2023), two containers labeled boys and girls (to collect offerings with), Bibles.

Play the video for the children. Say, "This is just one of the ways that this special offering goes to share the good news of Jesus! The money raised by churches helps to send people to meet the needs of those who have been devastated by storms or other disasters. It also helps to form new churches, and sends people on mission trips."

Read aloud Philippians 4:14-20. Say, "Paul wrote this letter to a church that had given him what he needed to share the good news of Jesus on his mission trips. The Lord will use any gift that is given, just like this offering, to meet the needs of people so that they might come to know Him as their Savior and King." Instruct the children to give as they feel led. Encourage them to continue to bring their gifts throughout the week for this offering. Use the two containers labeled boys and girls to collect the offerings. Challenge the children to see who can give the most between the boys and the girls in the class.

Move Activity: "Growing and Going" (15 minutes)

Materials Needed: styrofoam cups, soil, flower seeds, markers, crayons

Preparation: Fill cups with soil.

Ask, "What do you think the word harvest means?" Give time for answers. Explain, "The harvest is when the crops are ready to be gathered, when the vegetables in the garden are ready to be pulled, and when the flowers are ready to be picked." Say, "The Bible shares with us that God is the Lord of the harvest. This means that God is the only one that can help people realize their need for Him. However, He does use us to share the good news! He uses us to minister to the needs of those around us, like we learned about in the video!"

Ask, "What do plants need to grow?" For example, food, water, sunlight, good soil, etc.

Say, "Just like seeds need to be planted and cared for before they bloom, it is important that we minister to the needs of those around us by sharing God's love with them."

Ask, "What are ways that we can minister to those around us?" For example, being a friend to someone who does not have very many friends, helping someone in need, etc. Give time for responses.

Instruct kids to plant the seeds in the soil.

Say, "When you see this plant and as you take care of it, ask the Lord to help you find ways to minister and share the good news with those around you!"

Memorize: "The Lord of the Harvest" (15 minutes)

Materials Needed: index cards, sharpie

Preparation: Write out Matthew 9:38 using index cards.

Scramble the index cards up. Instruct children to work together to put the verse in order. Time children as they complete the activity. Encourage children to try to beat their times.
